	Terrestrial Mammals	Taking of all Appendix I terrestrial mammals is prohibited. • Law n° 06-14 of 14 November 2006 on the protection and conservation of animal species threatened with extinction.
	Birds	Taking of all Appendix I birds is prohibited. • Law n° 04-07 of 14 August 2004 on hunting. • Law n° 06-14 of 14 November 2006 on the protection and conservation of animal species threatened with extinction. • Ordinance n° 06-05 of 15 July 2006 on the protection and conservation of animal species threatened with extinction. • Executive decree n° 12-235 of 24 May 2012 listing non-domestic protected animal species.

	Fish	Taking of all Appendix I fish is prohibited, but no law is identified.

			exception.
		Terrestrial Mammals	None granted, but Law n° 04-17, Article 53 provides grounds for exceptions.
		Birds	None granted, but Law n° 04-17, Article 53; and Ordinance n° 06-05, Article 4; provide grounds for an exception for scientific research and reproduction.
		Reptiles	None granted, but no law is identified to determine the scope of permissible exceptions.
